#### 9. Flood Alert / River Flows.

- Rivers Indus at Taunsa (Rising) & River Kabul at Nowshera are in medium flood level while River Indus at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma, Guddu & Sukkur is in low flood level.
- Severe flash flooding is expected in the Hill Torrents of D.G. Khan Division along with Rivers/Nullahs of eastern Balochistan during 18<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2022.
- Flows from Hill Torrents of D.G. Khan Division may cause medium to high level flooding in River Indus at Taunsa, Guddu & Sukkur.
- Severe urban flooding is also expected in Sindh on 18<sup>th</sup> August, 2022.
- Wet spell may cause severe flash flooding in Rivers/ Nullahs of Balochistan & hill torrents of DG Khan Division on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2022. Flows from hill torrents of DG Khan Division may cause medium to high level flooding in river Indus at Nowshera & tributaries of Rivers Kabul & Indus from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2022.

13. Weather Forecast for next 24 hours by PMD. Widespread thunderstorm/rain with heavy to very heavy falls at scattered places and extremely heavy falls at isolated places is expected over Sindh & eastern Balochistan. Scattered to widespread thunderstorm/rain of moderate to heavy intensity with isolated very heavy falls is expected over Bahawalpur, D.G. Khan, Multan, Sargodha & D.I. Khan Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over rest of the country.

#### 14. Weather Alert / Advisory / Press Release

- a. Met Office informed that the monsoon low-pressure area persists over eastern Sindh and adjoining west Rajasthan(India).Under the influence of this weather system:
  - Widespread Rain-thunderstorms with scattered heavy /very heavy falls (extremely heavy at times) & accompanied with occasional strong winds likely to occur in Shaheed Benazirabad, Noshero Feroz, Khairpur, Sukkur, Larkana, Ghotki, Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Dadu, Jamshoro, Kambar Shahdadkot, Tharparker, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Badin, Tando Muhammad khan, Tando Allayar, Hyderabad, Matiari, Thatta, Sujawal, Sanghar distts & Karachi division till 19 August.
  - Widespread Rain-wind/thunderstorms with scattered heavy /very heavy falls (extremely heavy at times) also expected in Lasbella, Khuzdar, Jhal Magsi, Jahfarabad, Nasirabad, Kohlu, Zhob, Pishin,Qilla Saifullah, Barkhan, Musakhel, Chaman, Loralai, Ziarat, Quetta,

Mastung, Kalat, Panjgur, Kharan, Nushki, Awaran and Turbat from today to 21 August.

The continuing wet spell over northeastern & southern districts of Balochistan to become
intense during 18-20 August which may trigger flash flooding in Dadu, Jamshoro, Kambar
Shahdadkot districts & downstream.

#### b. **Impacts**:

- Heavy falls may create water-logging/urban flooding in low lying areas of Karachi, Hyderabad, Badin, Thatta, Sujawal, Umarkot, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Tando Muhammad khan, Tando Allayar, Dadu, Jamshoro, Noshero Feroz, Shaheed Benazirabad, Kambar Shahdadkot, Larkana & Sukkur districts today & tomorrow.
- Heavy falls may trigger flash flooding/hill torrents in local nullahs of Zhob, Pishin, Chaman,
   Qilla Saifulla, Loralai, Jhal Magsi, Jafarabad, Nasirabad, Ziarat, Pishin, Khuzdar,
   Musakhel, Lasbella, Kalat, Quetta, Mastung and Ziarat during the forecast period.
- Persistent heavy rains over Khuzdar, Lasbella and Hub distts of Balochistan & over Kirthar
   Range may create extra pressure on Hub dam, Thaddo dam & downstream nullahs.
