#### 15. Weather Forecast for next 24 hours by PMD.

- Scattered to Widespread thunderstorm/rain of heavy intensity with isolated very heavy falls is expected over the Upper catchments of Rivers Kabul and Indus.
- Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Eastern Balochistan, Islamabad and DG Khan, DI Khan, Kohat, Bannu, Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Bahawalpur & Larkana Divisions.
- Isolated thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is expected over rest of the country except Western Balochistan.

#### 16. Weather Alert / Advisory / Press Release

- Met Office informed that according to Latest Hydro-Meteorological conditions and releases from TARBELA Dam, River Indus at KALABAGH & CHASHMA may attain HIGH TO VERY HIGH Flood Level ranging between 5,50,000 Cusecs to 7,00,000 Cusecs from 1200 PST of 27-08-2022 to 1200 PST of 28-08-2022.
- In view of the above situation, all concerned Authorities are advised to remain ALERT and take all necessary precautionary measures well in time to avoid loss of life and property.
