- thunderstorms / rain with HEAVY TO VERY HEAVY Falls at scattered places expected over Sindh, Eastern and Coastal Balochistan along with DG Khan Division. Scattered thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy falls expected over the Upper Catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Multan & Bahawalpur Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is also expected over Lahore, Faisalabad & Sahiwal Divisions.
- 6. Rainfall Last 24 Hours. Attached as Annex B.
- 7. <u>Weather Alert / Advisory / Press Release</u>. Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has issued a forecast informing that strong Monsoon currents affecting Upper Parts of the Country is likely to enter Sindh & Northeast / Eastern Balochistan from **22 / 23 July**. Under the influence of this system and possible interaction of moist currents from the North Arabian Sea, following is expected:
 - a. <u>Balochistan</u>. Widespread rain-wind/ thunderstorms with scattered heavy to very heavy falls are likely to occur in Districts Barkhan, Hub, Sibbi, Jaffarabad, Jhalmagsi, Khuzdar, Kohlu, Lasbela, Naseerabad, Qila Saifullah and along the Kirthar Range from 24 26 July (Sunday-Tuesday).
 - b. <u>Sindh</u>. Widespread rain-wind/ thunderstorms with scattered heavy to very heavy falls are likely to occur in Districts Dadu, Qambar-Shahdadkot and Jamshoro from 23 26 July (Saturday-Tuesday).

- 8. <u>Flood Warning / Alert</u>. River Kabul at Nowshera is in Medium Flood level, while River Indus at Taunsa is in Low Flood. **Medium To High Level Flooding** is still expected in the Hill Torrents of D.G Khan Division during next 24-hours. **Heavy to Very Heavy Rains** may generate **URBAN FLOODING** in Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Shaheed Benazirabad, Jamshoro, Mirpurkhas, Dadu, Umerkot, Jacobabad, Larkana and Sukkur from 25-26 July 2022 (Monday-Tuesday). **FLASH FLOODING** is also expected in local Nullahs of Loralai, Barkhan, Kohlu, Musakhel, Sherani, Sibbi and Bolan from 25-26 July 2022 (Monday-Tuesday).
