c. Relief Activities

(1) PDMA Balochistan.

- 100x tents, 400x quilts, 520x jerry cans, 630x mosquito nets, 30x water tanks(400 gln), 400x Tarpaulins, 300 x gas cylinders, 50x first aid kits, and 420x water coolers were issued to affected areas of District Quetta, Qilla Saifullah and Pishin.
- 100x Life Jackets dispatched to the wing commander, southern command.
- 15x Life Jackets dispatched to Irrigation Department.
- (2) <u>Upper Chitral.</u> Food and Non-food items were provided to the affectees by the district administration.
- (3) <u>District Sujawal.</u> 20x families in chuhar jamali have been settled in a school temporarily. A team of doctors is deputed there already with essentials medicines. Food for the families is regularly being provided.

d. Relief Camps Established. NTR

- e. Rehabilitation Activities.
 - (1) **District Quetta.** PDMA Dewatering Operations Completed.
 - (2) **District Sujawal.** Dewatering Operation is under process.
 - (3) <u>District Ghizer.</u> Restoration work is in progress at Sherqillah Nullah and Darkut Bridge has been restored temporarily.
 - (4) <u>District Hunza</u> NHA has been directed to move machinery and start working on mitigation measures at Batura bridge.

f. Rescue Activities

- (1) <u>District Ghizer.</u> Search operation is under process for the 2x missing dead bodies of children in Sherqilla, District Ghizer.
- (2) <u>District Lasbela.</u> People stranded in water in village Daam are being evacuated in boats.
- (3) <u>Lath Dam</u>. Flood release Party from Army moved to M-9 culvert and Jam / some Goth areas of Gaddap. In addition, 2 x parties of Army carried out dewatering of M- 9 and surrounding areas as water from outflow of Lath 2 Dam hit the M- 9. Furthermore another party under moved to Jam / Somu Goth for physical recce of aforementioned areas to ascertain the on ground situation and subsequent evacuation operations in both Goths.
- (4) <u>Karachi</u>. Pakistan Army and Pakistan Navy personnel are involved in support of rescue and relief efforts in affected areas.

- 5. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with South & Southeast Sindh, Balochistan, Islamabad and Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala & DG Khan Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Lahore, Faisalabad, Sahiwal, Multan & Bahawalpur Divisions.
- 6. Rainfall Last 24 Hours. Attached as Annex B.
- 7. Weather Advisory / Press Release. In response to PMD Weather Forecast, NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 7th July 2022, that monsoon currents are continuously penetrating in the country and may strengthen during the weekend i.e. Eid Holidays from 9-12 July. As a result of this, the expected weather will be as under:
 - a. **Islamabad** Rain-wind/thundershower is expected from Saturday 09th July to Tuesday 12th July with heavy falls on Saturday 09th and Sunday 10th July.
 - b. Balochistan Rain-wind/thundershower (Isolated heavy falls) are expected in Zhob, Ziarat, Barkhan, Loralai, Bolan, Kohlu, Quetta, Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbela, Awaran, Naseerabad, Sibbi, Panjgur, Turbat during Friday 08th July and Saturday 09th July.
 - c. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Rain-wind/thundershower are expected in Swat, Mansehra, Kohistan, Abbottabad, Haripur, Peshawar, Mardan, Swabi, Nowshera, Kurram, Kohat from Saturday 09th July to Tuesday 12th July and with heavy falls in Peshawar, Mardan, Kurram, Dir, Mansehra, Abbottabad Saturday 09th and Sunday 10th July.
 - d. **Punjab** Rain-wind/thundershower are expected in Mianwali, Sargodha, Hafizabad, M.B Din, Rawalpindi, Murree, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Sheikhupura, Faisalabad, Jhang,

- Sahiwal, Okara, from Saturday 09th July to Tuesday 12th July and with heavy falls in Gujranwala, Sialkot, Hafizabad, Lahore, Faisalabad and Sargodha on Saturday 09th and Sunday 10th July.
- e. <u>Sindh</u> Rain-wind/thundershower (Isolated heavy falls) are expected in Mirpurkhas, Dadu, Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin during Friday 08th July to Saturday 09th July.
- f. <u>Azad Jammu & Kashmir</u> Rain-windstorm/thundershower are expected in Kashmir from Saturday 09th July to Tuesday 12th July.
- 8. <u>Flood Warning / Alert</u>. No Flood Situation is observed in any of the Major Rivers. Under the influence of forecasted wet spell during 9th to 10th July 2022, flows are likely to increase in Rivers Ravi, Chenab, Jhelum (Mangla upstream) and Kabul. Flows are also likely to increase in the associated Nullahs of Rivers Ravi and Chenab from 9th to 11th July 2022. Light to Moderate Flooding is also expected in the Hill Torrents of DG Khan Division along with Tributaries of River Kabul during the same period. **Reference:** FFD Bulletin No. A-024/22 dated 8th July 2022.
