#### c. Relief Activities

- (1) PDMA Balochistan. 500x Tents, 400x Tarpaulins, 400x Quilts, 400x Mosquito Nets, 400x Jerry Cans, 400x Water Coolers, 400x Gas Cylinders (10kg), 500x Food Packets and 15x Life Saving jackets were issued to flood affected areas of District Zhob, Kacchi, Pishin, Qilla Saifullah, Zhob and Sohbatpur by PDMA Balochistan.
- (2) <u>SDMA AJ&K</u>. 56x Tents, 16x Plastic Mates, 88x Plastic sheets, 11x mattresses, 09x Kitchen sets, 18x shawls, 09x water gallons, 35x medicine kits and 35x food Packs were issued to affected areas of District Neelum, Jhelum Valley and Muzaffarabad by SDMA.
- d. Relief Camps Established. NTR
- e. Rehabilitation Activities.
  - (1) <u>District Hunza</u>. 01x wheel excavator and 01x dumper are deployed on to divert water course of Batura Nullah to its original path for protection of KKH.
  - (2) <u>District Ghizer</u>. Damage assessment of floods at Sherqillah, Thoi Yasin and Japuky are in progress.

#### f. Rescue Activities

- District Zhob. 01x dead body recovered by DDMA from district Zhob, which was missing during flash floods.
- g. <u>Aviation Activities</u>. PDMA Balochistan sent Relief Items (100 Food Packets) through Helicopter (Air Drop) to Qamar-Din Karaiz district Zhob.

- 5. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Islamabad and Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Lahore, DG Khan & Kalat Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over South & Southeast Sindh, rest of Balochistan along with Faisalabad, Sahiwal, Multan & Bahawalpur Divisions.
- 6. Rainfall Last 24 Hours. Attached as Annex B.
- 7. Weather Advisory / Press Release. In response to PMD Weather Forecast, NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2022, that monsoon currents from the Bay of Bengal are continuously penetrating Upper & Central Parts of the Country, while another Strong Monsoon Low Pressure Area is likely to approach Sindh on 14 July (Thursday), under the influence of this system, following is expected:
  - a. <u>Islamabad Capital Territory</u>. More Intermittent Rain-wind/ thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Islamabad from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
  - b. <u>Balochistan</u>. More Widespread Intermittent Heavy to Very Heavy Rain-wind / Thundershowers expected in Awaran, Barkhan, Bolan, Dera Bugti, Jaffarabad, Jhalmagsi, Kalat, Khuzdar, Kohlu, Lasbela, Loralai, Naseerabad, Panjgur, Pasni, Sibbi, Turbat, Zhob and Ziarat from 14-17 July (Thursday-Sunday).
  - c. **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa**. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Abbottabad, Bannu, Haripur, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi and Swat from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
  - d. <u>Punjab</u>. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Attock, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Bhakkar, Chakwal, Dera Ghazi Khan, Faisalabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhang, Jhelum, Khanpur, Lahore, Layyah, Mandi Bahauddin, Mianwali, Multan, Murree, Narowal, Okara, Rahim Yar Khan, Rajanpur, Rawalpindi, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Sheikhupura and Sialkot from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
  - e. <u>Sindh</u>. More Widespread Intermittent Heavy to Very Heavy Rain-wind / Thundershowers expected in Badin, Dadu, Ghotki, Hyderabad, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Kashmore, Karachi, Larkana, Mirpurkhas, Mithi, Naushero Feroze, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Qambar Shahdadkot, Shikarpur, Sukkur, Tharparkar, Thatta and Umerkot from 14-17 July (Thursday-Sunday)
  - f. Azad Jammu & Kashmir. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in AJ&K from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
- 8. **Flood Warning / Alert**. No Flood Situation is observed in any of the Major Rivers.

Under the influence of forecasted wet spell during 9th to 10th July 2022, flows are likely to increase in Rivers Ravi, Chenab, Jhelum (Mangla upstream) and Kabul. Flows are also likely to increase in the associated Nullahs of Rivers Ravi and Chenab from 9th to 11th July 2022. Light to Moderate Flooding is also expected in the Hill Torrents of DG Khan Division along with Tributaries of River Kabul during the same period. **Reference:** FFD Bulletin No. A-024/22 dated 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2022.
