Survey of damaged infrastructure is underway and data will be updated on receipt of final reports.

c. Relief Activities

- (1) <u>District Swabi</u>. 05x tents, 04x iron beds, 11x blankets, 05x mats, 04x gas cylinders, 04x solar torches with solar cells, 04x pillows, 02x family packs, 04x bed sheets and 05x prayer mats were distributed amongst the affectees.
- (2) <u>District Swat</u>. Non food items including Tent, Mattress, Kitchen Set, Hygiene Kit, Plastic Mats and Quilts were also handed over to the affected family. The injured individuals shifted to Saidu hospitals for further treatment.
- (3) <u>District Muzaffargarh</u>. After breach in main canal at Utra Snadila, announcements were made in mosque to evacuate the area. Rescue 1122 teams reached the spot.
- (4) <u>District Dera Bugti</u>. PDMA Balochistan has dispatched Relief items to flood affected district.
- (5) <u>District Lasbella</u>. Diversion has been established by District Administration and traffic partially resumed. Heavy machinery is at site and repair work is in progress.
- (6) PDMA Balochistan. 300x Tents, 300x Tarpaulins, 300x Quilts, 600x Mosquito Nets, 300x Jerry Cans, 300x Water Coolers, 300x kitchen sets and 300x Food Packets were issued to flood affected areas of Districts.

d. Relief Camps Established

- (1) <u>District Shergilla</u>. Tent village with medical facilities is functional at Sherqilla.
- (2) <u>District Muzzaffargarh</u>. Relief camp being established in Boys Primary School

at Utra Sandila.

e. Rehabilitation Activities

- District Hunza. Tractor of B&R department has been mobilized to restore Misgar Valley road.
- (2) <u>District Nagar</u>. Restoration of Hisper road is in progress through B&R department.
- (3) <u>District Skardu</u>. Restoration of Tormic road and power supply by GBPWD and damaged drinking water channel by LG&RD and Water Management in Tormic is in progress.

- 5. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD. Scattered to widespread thunderstorm/rain of moderate to heavy intensity with isolated very heavy falls is expected over Sindh, Balochistan along with Bahawalpur and D.G. Khan Divisions. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is also expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Peshawar Kohat, Bannu,
 - D.I. Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Lahore, Faisalabad & Sahiwal Divisions
- 6. Rainfall Last 24 Hours. Attached as Annex B.
- 7. Weather Advisory / Press Release. In response to PMD Weather Forecast, NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 12th July 2022, that monsoon currents from the Bay of Bengal are continuously penetrating Upper & Central Parts of the Country, while another Strong Monsoon Low Pressure Area is likely to approach Sindh on 14 July (Thursday), under the influence of this system, following is expected:
 - a. <u>Islamabad Capital Territory</u>. More Intermittent Rain-wind/ thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Islamabad from 13-15 July

(Wednesday-Friday).

- b. <u>Balochistan</u>. More Widespread Intermittent Heavy to Very Heavy Rain-wind / Thundershowers expected in Awaran, Barkhan, Bolan, Dera Bugti, Jaffarabad, Jhalmagsi, Kalat, Khuzdar, Kohlu, Lasbela, Loralai, Naseerabad, Panjgur, Pasni, Sibbi, Turbat, Zhob and Ziarat from 14-17 July (Thursday-Sunday).
- c. <u>Khyber Pakhtunkhwa</u>. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Abbottabad, Bannu, Haripur, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi and Swat from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
- d. **Punjab**. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Attock, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Bhakkar, Chakwal, Dera Ghazi Khan, Faisalabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhang, Jhelum, Khanpur, Lahore, Layyah, Mandi Bahauddin, Mianwali, Multan, Murree, Narowal, Okara, Rahim Yar Khan, Rajanpur, Rawalpindi, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Sheikhupura and Sialkot from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
- e. <u>Sindh</u>. More Widespread Intermittent Heavy to Very Heavy Rain-wind / Thundershowers expected in Badin, Dadu, Ghotki, Hyderabad, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Kashmore, Karachi, Larkana, Mirpurkhas, Mithi, Naushero Feroze, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Qambar Shahdadkot, Shikarpur, Sukkur, Tharparkar, Thatta and Umerkot from 14-17 July (Thursday-Sunday)
- f. **Azad Jammu & Kashmir**. More Intermittent Rain-wind / Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in AJ&K from 13-15 July (Wednesday-Friday).
- 8. **Flood Warning / Alert**. Medium to High level flooding is expected in the hill torrents of DG Khan Division along with Rivers/Nullahs of Balochistan from 14th to 17th July-2022. Urban flooding in Sindh is most likely during the same period. **Reference:** FFD Bulletin No. A-030/22 dated 14th July, 2022.
