**SUBJECT: -RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:****I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:**

River Indus at Taunsa & Guddu and River Sutlej at Sulemanki are in Medium flood level. River Indus at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma & Sukkur, River Kabul at Nowshera, River Chenab at Marala and River Ravi at Balloki & Sidhnai are in Low flood.

**ALERT: Moderate to heavy Flash flooding is expected in tributaries of River Kabul along with Hill torrents of DG Khan division during next 24Hrs. Due to combining effect of Downstream discharges from Taunsa and Punjnad, River Indus at GUDDU may attain High Flood level on 30<sup>th</sup> July-2023 and SUKKUR on 31<sup>st</sup> July-2023.**

**II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:**

- a. Yesterday's Well-marked low-pressure area over South Odisha (old Orissa) moved Northwards and weakened into Low. It is very likely to move away Northeastwards and become insignificant for the country.
- b. Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northeast Afghanistan today lies over Northern parts of the country.
- c. Light to moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal & Arabian Sea are penetrating to upper parts of the country up to 5000 feet.
- d. Weak Seasonal low lies over Northwest Balochistan.

**III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:**

Scattered to widespread wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of River Kabul & Indus along with Lahore & Gujranwala Divisions. Scattered wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Islamabad and Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Multan, DG Khan, Zhob, Loralai, Kalat, Sibbi, Makran & Nasirabad Divisions. Isolated wind thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is expected over Sargodha & Bahawalpur Divisions.

**IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS:**

Wet spell is likely to decrease.
