Fairly wide spread wind-thunderstorm/ rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers. Fairly wide spread wind-thunderstorm/ rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore, Faisalabad, Sahiwal, Multan, Bahawalpur & DG Khan Divisions.

In response to PMD Weather Forecast, NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 19 June, that Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has informed that strong weather system is likely to enter Upper and Central parts of the Country from **Monday**, **20 June**. Under the influence of this system the following weather conditions are expected: -

#### a. Islamabad

- Widespread rain-windstorms / thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated hailstorms expected in Islamabad from Monday, 20 June – Wednesday, 22 June.
- o Heavy downpours may cause urban flooding during the forecasted period.

### b. **Balochistan**

 Widespread rain-windstorms / thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated hailstorms expected in, Barkhan, Kohlu, Musakhel, Sherani and Zhob from Monday, 20 June – Wednesday, 22 June. Wind-thunderstorms-rain expected in Dera Bugti, Jaffarabad, Naseerabad,
 Lasbela and Khuzdar from Tuesday, 21 June (evening / night) – Wednesday,
 22 June.

#### c. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

- Widespread rain-windstorms / thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated hailstorms expected in Abbottabad, Bannu, Bajaur, Charsadda, Chitral, Dera Ismail Khan, Dir, Galiyat, Haripur, Khyber, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi, Swat and Waziristan from Monday, 20 June – Wednesday, 22 June.
- Heavy downpours may cause urban flooding in Mardan, Nowshera and Peshawar during the forecasted period.

### d. **Punjab**

- Widespread rain-windstorms / thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated hailstorms expected in Attock, Bahawalnagar, Bhakkar, Chakwal, Dera Ghazi Khan, Faisalabad, Hafizabad, Jhang, Jhelum, Kasur, Khushab, Lahore, Layyah, Mandibahauddin, Mianwali, Multan, Murree, Narowal, Okara, Pakpattan, Rawalpindi, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Sheikhupura, Sialkot and Toba Tek Singh from Monday, 20 June – Wednesday, 22 June.
- Heavy downpours may cause urban flooding in Faisalabad, Gujranwala Lahore, Rawalpindi and Sargodha during the forecasted period.

#### e. Sindh

 Wind-thunderstorms-rain expected in Sukkur, Larkana, Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Shaheed Benazirabad, Dadu, Jamshoro, Hyderabad, Karachi, from Tuesday, 21 June (evening / night) – Wednesday, 22 June.
