7. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD.

Scattered thunderstorm/ rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Rawalpindi, Bahawalpur and DG Khan Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/ rain of moderate intensity is expected over the rest of Punjab along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu and D.I Khan Divisions.

9 Weather Advisory / Press Release.

In response to PMD Weather Forecast, NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 14 June, that pre-monsoon rains / thunderstorms are expected from **Wednesday**, **15 June (evening / night)**. Under the influence of this system the following weather is forecasted: -

- a. <u>Islamabad</u>. Rain-wind / thundershowers are expected from Thursday,
 16 June Tuesday, 21 June. Furthermore, Heavy Falls are expected on Thursday,
 16 June (evening / night) and Friday,
 17 June which may generate Urban Flooding.
- Balochistan. Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls are expected in Sibbi, Bolan, Naseerabad, Jhalmagsi, Mastung, Barkhan, Ziarat, Quetta, Kalat, Khuzdar, Chaman and Harnai from Friday, 17 June (evening / night) Monday, 20 June.
- c. <u>Khyber Pakhtunkhwa</u>. Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Abbottabad, Bannu, Chitral, Dera Ismail Khan, Dir, Haripur, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi, Swat and Waziristan from Wednesday, 15 June Wednesday, 22 June (with occasional gaps).
- d. <u>Punjab</u>. Rain-wind / thundershowers are expected in Attock, Rawalpindi, Murree, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mianwali, Sargodha, Khushab, Hafizabad, Mandibahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh from Thursday, 16 June Tuesday, 21 June. Furthermore, rain-wind / thundershowers are also expected in Multan, Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur, Bhakkar, Layyah, Muzaffargarh, Kot Adu, Sahiwal, Khanewal, Pakpattan, Okara, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Khanpur and Rahim Yar Khan from Friday, 17 June Monday, 20 June (with occasional gaps). Furthermore, Heavy Falls are expected in Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Lahore, Kasur and Sheikhupura on Thursday, 16 June (evening / night) and Friday, 17 June that may generation Urban Flooding.
- e. <u>Sindh</u>. Hot and dry weather in most parts of the Province with chances of dust-thunderstorms / rain in Sukkur, Jacobabad and Larkana <u>Azad Jammu & Kashmir</u>. Rain-wind / thundershowers with a few heavy falls expected in Bagh, Bhimber, Hattian, Haveli, Kotli, Mirpur, Muzaffarabad & Neelum Valley from Wednesday, 15 June (evening / night) Thursday, 23 Junefrom Friday, 17 June (evening / night) Sunday, 19 June.
- f. <u>Gilgit-Baltistan</u>. Rain-wind / thundershowers with a few heavy falls expected in Astore, Diamer, Ghizer, Gilgit, Hunza & Skardu from Wednesday, 15 June (evening / night) Thursday, 23 June.
