SUBJECT: -RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:**I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:**

All the Major Rivers are flowing Below Low Flood level. River Jhelum at Mangla (upstream), River Kabul & River Chenab are likely to attain low to medium flood level during next 48-hours.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- a. Yesterday's trough of westerly over Northern parts of the country continues to persist.
- b. Yesterday's well marked low over central parts of Madhya Pradesh today lies over Southeast Rajasthan & adjoining area.
- c. Light to moderate moist currents from Arabian Sea & Bay of Bengal are penetrating to lower half of the country up to 7000 feet. These are likely to intensify.
- d. Seasonal low lies over West Balochistan.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Scattered wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers, Islamabad, South Sindh along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore, Faisalabad & Sahiwal Divisions. Isolated wind thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is expected over East Balochistan along with Multan, D.G Khan & Bahawalpur Divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK UP TO 20th SEPTEMBER:

Monsoon activity is likely to increase over South Sindh and East Balochistan, while no significant change is expected over rest of the country.
